GEN GIAP. DELEGATION WATCH SRV-USSR SPACE LAUNCH

[Text] Hanoi VNA July 24--A delegation of the Communist Party of Vietnam and the Government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam yesterday afternoon arrived in Baykonur city to visit the Baykonur cosmodrome and attend the launching of the "Soyuz-37" spaceship with the Vietnam-Soviet international crew on board.

The delegation, led by General Vo Nguyen Giap, member of the Political Bureau of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Vietnam and vice premier, includes Xuan Thuy, secretary of the party Central Committee, vice chairman of the Standing Committee of the National Assembly and president of the Vietnam-USSR Friendship Association; Major General Vu Xuan Chiem, vice minister of national defence; Tran Dai Nghia, director of the Vietnam Institute of Sciences and president of the Vietnam Space Research Commission.

The delegates were welcomed at the airport by representatives of the local party and administrative authorities, the command of the Baykonur Cosmodrome, Lieutenant General V.A. Shatalov and Major General A.A. Leonov in charge of the training of Soviet cosmonauts, and many specialists in cosmic science and technology. Thousands of representatives of the local population lined the streets, waving flags and flowers to welcome the delegation. The delegates cordially chatted with the cosmonauts at the cosmonaut training complex and planted souvenir trees in the cosmonauts garden.

Lieutenant General V.A. Shatalov showed the delegation round the various establishments and facilities at the complex. The delegation visited the assembly complex for booster-rockets and spaceships, the launching pad and the memorial about the first man-made earth satellite launched in October 1957 from this launching pad. The delegation also visited the modest houses of Yuriy Gagarin, the pioneer of manned space flight, and of S.P. Koralov, the designer who had made many big contributions to the building of Soviet rockets and spaceships, and later visited the museum at the Baykonur cosmodrome.

The delegation saw the Vietnamese and Soviet cosmonauts donning their spacesuits and took part in the send-off before they left for the launching pad. The two cosmonauts reported to the representatives of the two countries that they were ready, and pledged to fulfil the noble mission assigned them. From inside the spaceship they read their statements to the world. Then the delegation witnessed the launching of the "Soyuz-37" spaceship with V.V. Gorbatko and Pham Tuan on board.
