The Danuri is a domestically developed space vehicle. Carried by SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket. the unmanned space vehicle was launched from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida on Aug. 5.

After being launched into space, the Danuri headed for the moon using a ballistic lunar transfer trajectory method that uses gravity from Visitors will need to carry their ID.
