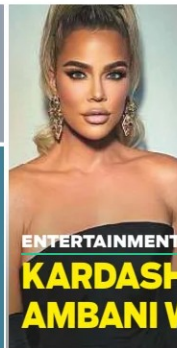

New deal to enhance astronaut health care

MBRSC partners with Dubai Health to ensure optimal fitness for space missions

Dubai's space and health agencies have teamed up to protect the health and safety of UAE astronauts before, during and after missions.
